The book of the month for May is “Uncommon Fruits for Every Garden” written by Lee Reich, who also brought us “The Ever Curious Gardener”, our book of the month for April. This book was written in 2004 and updated in 2014 by Timber Press.

This book is very specialized; it only talks about fruit and only those fruits that are considered uncommon in North America. It contains in-depth information on 23 different fruits, including paw paws, Nanking cherries, super hardy kiwis and jujubes as well as a description of the fruits, cultivation, propagation, harvest and use and a description of all cultivars using both common and Latin names.

We found the book easy to understand and very interesting, as we have started growing several of these fruits ourselves.

These fruits can take a little extra care and protection, but the results give you great flavours and a great deal of pride and satisfaction.
